2018-2019 STATE CHARITY APPLICATION

For over forty years, the NJASC State Charity program has inspired the student leaders of New Jersey to raise funds and awareness for a variety of causes of particular interest.

What is NJASC looking for in a potential State Charity?

- A NEW JERSEY based non-profit charitable organization; all applicants must submit proof of their current 501(c)(3) status with the Internal Revenue Service.
- An organization that supports a charitable cause that will clearly connect with and be supported by the student leaders and faculty advisors of New Jersey.
- An organization for which a potential donation of approximately \$100,000 would make a SIGNIFICANT difference in its charitable efforts, but which is also ESTABLISHED enough so that it can adequately handle the business aspects of such a potential donation.
- An organization that agrees to keep all funds donated by NJASC as part of our State Charity program in NEW JERSEY or use them in support of a program based in a neighboring state (Pennsylvania, Delaware, New York) that would specifically benefit residents of NEW JERSEY.
- An organization that is eager to promote itself at NJASC conferences as well as to work with the students and advisors of member schools who may want to bring the charity in to speak.

The selection process will be as follows:

- Interested charities may complete and submit applications by **February 15, 2018**. This application will be posted online at www.njasc.org and may also be directly shared with potential applicant charitable organizations by any State Officer or one of the Executive Directors.
- The 2018 Executive Member in charge of State Charity will review all applications and prepare a report to all State Officers for their March 2018 Executive meeting. At this meeting, the State Officers will decide on three or four finalists.
- Each finalist will be invited to make a 20-minute presentation at the April 2018 Executive meeting (date T.B.D.), with a 10-minute question & answer period to follow. After all presentations are over, the State Officers will meet in closed session to select the next State Charity.
- The newly selected State Charity will be notified by the Executive Member in charge of State Charity; the announcement to the student leaders of our state will be made at the Spring Awards Program on May 30, 2018 (tentative) at Six Flags Great Adventure.

PART THREE – CONDITIONS:

If selected as the next State Charity, your charitable organization will need to agree and abide by ALL of the following conditions.

1. Your charitable organization **MUST** maintain its 501(c)(3) non-profit status with the Internal Revenue Service from the time of application through September 30, 2019. If for any reason your non-profit status is revoked by the Internal Revenue Service a representative from your charitable organization will immediately contact NJASC, which will reserve the right to continue or terminate this partnership.
2. Representatives of your charitable organization would be expected to be in attendance at the following NJASC Conferences:
 - **Spring Awards Program** at Six Flags Great Adventure – May 30, 2018 (tentative). To be announced as the new State Charity and meeting with students and advisors for two informal workshops afterward.
 - **Leadership Training Conference (LTC)** at The College of New Jersey – July 12 & 16, 2018. To make a half hour introductory presentation to delegates at our Second General Session.
 - **Fall Conference** at The College of New Jersey – October 2018 (date T.B.D.). To have a vendor table and meet informally with students and advisors during conference registration.
 - **Winter Convention** at The College of New Jersey – January 2019 (date T.B.D.). To have a vendor table, meet informally with students and advisors during conference registration, and present three forty-minute workshops to students.
 - **Spring Awards Program** at Six Flags Great Adventure – May 2019 (date T.B.D.). To be presented with what the anticipated overall donation amount will be (see #3 below) and briefly thank all in attendance for their support over the past year.
3. Representatives of your charitable organization would be expected to be accessible to student leaders and advisors, readily available to visit their schools in support of activities to raise awareness and funds for the State Charity. Arrangements for such visits can be made directly with the student leaders and advisors or their schools; NJASC does not need to be notified.
4. All State Charity donations will be paid directly to NJASC, and a single block donation on behalf of the student leaders of New Jersey would then be paid by NJASC to your charitable organization in September 2019. *Any donations made from our member schools directly to your charitable organization and not through NJASC will absolutely NOT be considered as part of our State Charity program, and will not be eligible for recognition or awards provided by NJASC.* We therefore request that such donations be returned to the school with instructions to resubmit the donation, by check payable to NJASC.
5. Any funds donated by NJASC to your charitable organization will be expected to remain in NEW JERSEY, or be used in support of a program based in a neighboring state (Pennsylvania, Delaware, New York) that will specifically benefit residents of NEW JERSEY.
