

Spirit Week Activities-EXPLANATION

1. Spirit spot -(plays on the morning show) Your grade should prepare a creative video clip that advertises or frames your grade's theme and enthusiasm for the week. It should be no longer than 1 minute and 15 seconds. Your spirit spot should be school appropriate. If it contains any inappropriate references, the clip will be disqualified.

CURRENT KHS STUDENTS ONLY SHOULD BE PRESENT IN THE VIDEO. No YouTube clips or photos.

- 2. Band Day- (Thursday during school) Each grade will appoint a band, which consists of its students to put together an 8-minute performance showcasing the student's talent. The song or medley of songs should go along with your theme. Bands must set up their equipment at 6:30 a.m. on the day of the competition. The school does not provide any equipment including extension cords. The performance cannot exceed 8 minutes, or disqualification will be put into place.
- 3. Color Day- (Friday during School-last two periods) Color day is a day filled with many different activities, including relay races, tug of war, a pie eating contest, and many more. For each event, a certain amount of students from each grade can volunteer. He/she can participate in only **one** activity, excluding tug of war.
- 4. Hallway Decoration- (Monday at 2:30 p.m.) Each class will be assigned a hallway to decorate after school and are encouraged to spotlight the Spirit Week theme. This event will begin after school Monday at 2:30 and must conclude by 4:00. There are new guidelines for permissible decorations; violation will result in disqualification. Classes will be judged not only on the presentation and following guidelines but also on clean-up which will take place Thursday, October 24 after school.
- 5. Dance Competition- (Wednesday and Thursday night) Classes MAY NOT EXCLUDE ANYONE who wishes to participate. Male participation is one of the judging criteria. Each class will perform a COMPLETELY ORIGINAL dance to a sound/music mix. The dance itself will not exceed 10 minutes, with no more than five minutes permitted for set up or clean up. Dances should include sound judgment in taste as well as music selection. Some reference towards the theme is strongly encouraged, though other criteria will weigh heavily on judging.
- 6. Karaoke: We are finalizing the rules for the event. Each class needs 2-4 people to participate in the event. They will be judged on crowd pleasing and the ability to sing along to the song. There will be more details to come. Students involved in the Karaoke event may not participate in more than 2 minutes of Band Day.
- 7. Banners- (Friday after-school at 2:30 p.m.) Classes will receive the same topic the night before to research and they will need to find a quote related to the topic and their theme. Each grade will receive the supplies for the first time and be permitted to work on their banner. People working on the banner may leave the room only to trade supplies, but may not bring anything back into the room that was not part of the original list. The grade must also type a short description about their banner that will be read during the presentation of the banners.
- 8. Quiz Bowl- (Tuesday during school)- 6 students from your grade will be part of a quiz bowl team. Each grade will be asked a question. If they answer it correctly, they will get 1 point. If they do not know the answer, they can pass it on to another grade. The other team can either attempt to answer the question for a point, or dare the questioning team to a physical challenge. In a physical challenge, 4 previously selected students (2 boys and 2 girls set aside before the activity) participate in whatever challenge the student council says. The winning team gets 1 point. If there is a tie at the end, they will receive the same question. They will wager the points. This applies to the top two teams in the event of a tie.
- **9. Volleyball-** 7 males and 7 females from each grade will compete. All are welcome.
- 10. Spirit Tweets- Students' tweets will be judged based on creativity and relation to the theme. In order for a tweet to be judged, the student must tag @Kinnelon_StuCo and indicate their class in a hashtag (i.e. #2014) The three best tweets according to the judging criteria per grade will be then scored. The grade with the highest overall score for their top tweets will win the event. TWEETS MUST BE APPROPRIATE INAPPROPRIATE TWEETS WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION. Tweets sent during school will not be judged.
- 11. Participation of each day: The Student Council Executive Board creates attendance sheets for each class for each second block during Spirit Week. The Advisor requests the information from the Guidance Office. The executive board students put the attendance sheets in the mailboxes of the teachers. The teachers take a attendance of the theme day (American Day, Anti-Bullying Day, etc.) and the executive board collects the sheets each day from each classroom. The executive board tallies all the students in each grade and calculates the percentage of students participated in each class.
- 12. Spirit Cans: Students bring in non-perishable items. Each item counts as a point. The grade with the most items wins and so on. The students must write their grade number on each item. They drop off the items in their class advisor's room and use a sharpie marker to record the grade number (9, 10, 11, 12).
- Find a local food pantry to donate the items.

 13. Spirit Donations: Students bring in clothing and other items to donate to a community. We chose a community in the Bronx. Each item is worth a value. For example, one point could be: yo-yos, rattles, figurines, t-shirts, deck of cards, books, matchbox cars or similar items. A higher value of 10 points could be: winter coats, heavy jackets, backpack, bikes or similar items. The executive board and other helpers counted the items and put them in storage bags/boxes. Call a local shelter to pick up the items.
